Please leave all personal items at home (toys, trading cards, iPads, etc.)

All coats, bags, etc. must be in coat room. Club is NOT responsible for lost or stolen items. The DAR Boys & Girls Club CEO & Program Director reserve the right to inspect any youth on the Club premises to find a particular item or as an investigation into illegal actions.

Check In/Out

All members must be walked into the entrance way by a parent to be checked in. Following a temperature check that is within normal range, the member will be allowed to proceed into the Club to sign in. Parents/guardians will not be allowed to go beyond the Club entrance.

Pick Up We encourage you to call the Club to have your child meet you outside or you can enter the entrance way and wait for a staff to assist you to sign your child/children out. If you call, please wait until you are physically on the premises of the Club. Any member leaving with someone other than their designated pick up person, must have signed permission.

Payments

\$20 registration and \$100 monthly

Teens (13+) only pay \$20 registration fee.

Monthly fees must be paid at the beginning of the month. Months are considered first of the month to the end of the month.

Cancellation Policy

In the event where severe weather or an emergency occurs and the Club needs to be closed, the decision to close the Club will be made by the CEO. Announcements will be made on local radio, Facebook, and Class Dojo.

Late Pick Up Policy

All members are required to be picked up no later than the Club posted closing time. If a parent/guardian is late and all attempts to reach emergency contacts have failed, the child/children will be considered abandoned and the local police department will be notified. Continued lateness more than 5 minutes will be charged \$5 per minute. Payment must be paid before member comes back to the program.

Social Distancing & Extra Precautions Taken

Staff and members will need to practice social distancing at all times. Staff will be taking extra precautions and doing additional cleaning throughout the day. Staff will be wearing a mask while at work and members will also be asked to wear a mask until we hear different from the health department. Members will need to stay with their small group for programming. Club members and staff will participate in regular scheduled hygiene practices to ensure safety of all. Club members must do their best to follow all expectations. Failure to do so can result in removal from our program. If a member becomes sick during the day, parents/guardians will be asked to pick up their sick child within 30 minutes. Initial here that you agree to policy. _____
We ask members to LEAVE all personal items at home. Any personal items brought to the Club will be kept and stored in coat room on hooks. We ask families to bring a water bottle for each child, as we will not be using the water fountain to drink from but only to refill their own bottle.

Supervision Policy

If your child has a disability and/or special needs which require increase supervision, the DAR Boys & Girls Club will strive to provide services through volunteers but reserve the right to require the guardian to provide such supervision or support at no cost to the DAR Boys & Girls Club and/or reserves the right to limit participation.

Dress Code

Club members are not permitted to wear clothing that is inappropriate for the Club setting. Clothing that displays profanity, violence, is sexually suggestive, is offensive, promotes gang activity, or promotes alcohol, tobacco, or drug uses are not appropriate. Clothing must cover the torso from above the chest cleave to mid-thigh. No hats, visors, or other head wear is allowed in the building. Footwear must be worn while at the Club. Closed toe shoes are strongly encouraged to protect feet during activities. Club staff has the right to limit participation in activities and program due to footwear.

Technology & Social Media Policy

We will use Zoom for the following anticipated program activities:

- Media sharing (for example, uploading images of artwork or other projects)

Our commitment to keeping the young people we serve safe is always our number one priority. The DAR Boys & Girls Clubs will actively monitor member activity on Zoom and will make every effort to protect member information by, among other things, maintaining control of, and access to, the data collected; prohibiting re-disclosure of member information; limiting the purposes for which the online platforms may use member information; ensuring there is no advertising and that no member information is collected for commercial purposes.

Further, all activities online must comply with The DAR Boys & Girls Club's safety policies, including the Code of Conduct, Acceptable Use Policy, Internet Safety Policy, and the Prohibition of 1:1 Contact Policy.

Assumption of the Risk and Waiver of Liability Relating to Coronavirus/COVID-19 & Any Highly Infectious Illness

The novel coronavirus, COVID-19, has been declared a worldwide pandemic by the World Health Organization. **COVID-19 is extremely contagious** and is believed to spread mainly from person-to-person contact. As a result, federal, state, and local governments and federal and state health agencies recommend social distancing and have, in many locations, prohibited the congregation of groups of people.

The DAR Boys & Girls Club has put in place preventative measures to reduce the spread of COVID-19; however, the Club **cannot guarantee** that you or your child(ren) will not become infected with COVID-19 or any highly infectious illness. Further, **attending the Club could increase** your risk and your child(ren)'s risk of contracting COVID-19.

By signing this agreement, I acknowledge the contagious nature of COVID-19/or any highly infectious illness and voluntarily assume the risk that my child(ren) and I may be exposed to or infected by COVID-19 by attending the Club and that such exposure or infection may result in personal injury, illness, permanent disability, and death. I understand that the risk of becoming exposed to or infected by COVID-19/other highly infectious illness at the Club may result from the actions, omissions, or negligence of myself and others, including, but not limited to, Club employees, volunteers, and program participants and their families.

I voluntarily agree to assume all of the foregoing risks and accept sole responsibility for any injury to my child(ren) or myself (including, but not limited to, personal injury, disability, and death), illness, damage, loss, claim, liability, or expense, of any kind, that I or my child(ren) may experience or incur in connection with my child(ren)'s attendance at the Club or participation in Club programming ("Claims"). On my behalf, and on behalf of my children, I hereby release, covenant not to sue, discharge, and hold harmless the Club, its employees, agents, and representatives, of and from the Claims, including all liabilities, claims, actions, damages, costs or expenses of any kind arising out of or relating thereto. Covid-19 Pandemic Policies & Procedures



- Have you been in contact with someone who tested positive for COVID in the last two weeks?
- **YOU NEED TO STAY HOME IF:** you have been within 6 feet of someone diagnosed with COVID-19 for 15 minutes or longer then you may return after 14 days from last exposure. **OR** If you have vomiting or diarrhea **ALONE**, **THEN** may return 24 hours after symptoms resolve without the use of medication.
- If any **ONE** Red Flag Symptoms you need to stay home if **YOU** or any household member have:
 - **New or Worsening Cough** **Shortness of Breath** **Difficulty Breathing**
 - **Loss of taste/smell** **Fever greater than 100.4**

OR

- If 2 or more yellow flag symptoms:
 - **Sore Throat** **Muscle or Body Aches** **Unusual Fatigue**
 - **Headache** **Nasal Congestion** **Runny Nose**
 - **Vomiting** **Diarrhea**
- If **YES**- Based on the public health guidelines for COVID and for the health and safety of all members, staff and volunteers you should **be out of the DAR Boys & Girls Club for 10 days** from the start of your symptoms.

ALSO

- Other members of the family must quarantine for 14 days from the last day of exposure to the sick person (if unable to isolate the sick child in the home – the quarantine starts after day 10 of the sick person).
- It is highly recommended that you contact your healthcare provider to consider being tested for COVID- if you receive a negative test result, you may return sooner (Except if they are a contact of a positive case).
- If **ONLY 1** yellow flag symptoms:
 - **Sore Throat** **Muscle or Body Aches** **Unusual Fatigue** **Vomiting**
 - **Headache** **Nasal Congestion** **Runny Nose** **Diarrhea**

- You can return to the Club once you are 24 hours free of symptoms and fever without the use of medication.

Keeping ill individuals who have been exposed to COVID, away from others, can slow the spread of the virus. It is possible for people who do not have symptoms to spread the virus to others.

Thank you for helping keep our members, staff and volunteers safe by staying home when you are sick.
